President Paxson welcomes attendees and provides an overview of the **BUCC agenda**, which includes the president's report and a panel discussion on community relations. This is the second of three panel-style conversations that the BUCC is adopting in the Spring of 2023.

In the President's report, **President Christina H. Paxson** provides participants with critical campuswide updates which include the following; construction of the integrated Life Sciences Building, approval of the Data Science Institute, ongoing academic innovation and transformation of the CareerLAB; and the vote for unionization by the undergraduate teaching assistants in computer science. President Paxson also provides updates on the College Access Program for Providence students, as well as Brown's current negotiations with the city of Providence, including a new memorandum of understanding. During the panel on community relations, facilitated by BUCC secretary **Olugbenga Joseph**, guest panelists **Katie Silberman** (Director of Community Relations, Office of Government and Community Relations) **Brenda Ice** (Senior Associate Dean & Senior Director of Residential Life) **Rodney Chatman** (Vice President for Campus Safety) and **Matthew Rauschenbach '23** (Bonner Community Fellow) provided their diverse perspectives on, and experience with, community relations efforts with the city of Providence.

During the discussion, panelists discussed the importance of building reciprocal relationships with the Providence community, understanding the ways in which Brown's presence is felt, and fostering more

opportunities for Brown students to be a “good neighbor”. Highlighted examples of community relations include Brown’s sponsoring of a full-lighting of WaterFire in the Fall of 2023, the Good Neighbor Program through ResLife that educates undergraduate students to live off campus, utilizing monthly newsletters and social media to improve reach. Panelists also talked about challenges to community relations as well, citing the importance of making the “knowing” and the “doing” of engaging with Brown more legible for Providence and the broader community.
