President Christina H. Paxson welcomed the Brown University Community Council (BUCC) and community members in the audience to the meeting.

A motion was made to approve the minutes from the BUCC meeting held on February 10, 2026. The motion was seconded and passed.

President Paxson reviewed the meeting agenda. This included hearing from and sharing feedback with Teneo Risk, the global consulting firm conducting a comprehensive assessment of campus safety and security under the direction of Brown's outside law firm. The agenda also included a presentation of the Real-Time Crime Center (RTCC) proposal by Interim Vice President for Public Safety and Chief of Police Hugh Clements, and dedicated time for open comment and questions from community members.

President Paxson provided an overview of the different opportunities for Brown community members to share input as part of the campus safety and security assessment, including at BUCC meetings, the DPSEM survey that will be administered later this month, and stakeholder focus groups that will take place in April. President Paxson then turned the floor to Teneo Risk.

Teneo Risk representatives, Courtney Adante and David Cagno, introduced themselves and described their roles in supporting the Teneo reviews. They provided an overview of the campus safety and security assessment objectives, the approach and methodology—including collecting community input, and next steps.

Next President Paxson invited Chief Clements to share an overview of the RTCC proposal. Chief Clements introduced himself and described the RTCC. Chief Clements emphasized the importance of gathering community feedback to inform Brown's considerations about whether to join the RTCC and how this partnership would be governed by the University.

President Paxson opened the floor for questions for Teneo Risk. BUCC members and Brown community members asked questions and shared comments with Teneo Risk related to the campus safety and security assessment and about public safety at Brown.

Then President Paxson opened the floor for questions for Chief Clements. BUCC members and Brown community members asked questions and shared comments with Chief Clements about the RTCC proposal.

President Paxson announced the next BUCC meeting will take place on Tuesday, April 14, 2026. The meeting adjourned.
